I was truly blessed to have Alvin, Jane, Emida, Raymond, Joseph, Debbie and Michelle on the programme team. They served with passion, pooling their talents to create videos and music performances which highlighted messages of hope and love arising

from the plight and struggles of those in need, especially the poor and the marginalised. I was especially touched by "Overcoming", a video featuring several beneficiaries and volunteers from Caritas Singapore member organisations describing their struggles, pains and prejudices

teenager speaking of the help he received from Brother Colin Wee at St Patrick's hostel. He said he was "cared for by none", took drugs and played truant, but through the unconditional love and care he received from Brother Colin, he "found hope in one".

Terrence and his team delivered beautiful songs of praise, uplifting our spirits throughout the evening. And how could I forget Henry, Francis and Theresa for their tireless efforts to ensure the smooth logistical running of the entire evening? Or Christopher, for his graphic talents? Also memorable were the entertaining song and dance contributions from the Migrants Community of the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes, the Archdiocesan Commission for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People, acts29 and the Family Life Society.

Social Mission Alive was a God-given blessing for me to serve in a community both talented and generous. I found myself much enriched in my faith and life experience, moved by their works and spirit.

Many participants of Social Mission Alive shared how they were inspired by the event in ways they could not describe. Such is the power of the Spirit to unite, to inspire and to move each of us towards serving others, unconditionally.

Indeed, we are many parts, and it is only through Him that we become One Body. The hand of God was evident each step of the way for the team and me, and I know that through Him, the spirit of service will continue to reign in the hearts and minds of all who were present.
