

Singapore is ranked 26th out of 136 in the world for income inequality. (A higher rank means greater inequality)



The top 10% wage earning households earn approximately 25 times more than the bottom 10%.

The top 20% earners saw their real wages rise by 27% between 1998 and 2010.









In 2008, 12-14% of Singaporean households had to survive on an income of less than \$1,500 per month.

In 2012, more than 100,000 Singaporeans and PRs earned less than \$1,000 a month despite working full time.

Still, the overall price of goods and services in Singapore increased by 13.1% over the last three years.

The price of a bowl of fishball noodles shot up by 20% in just one year from 2011 to 2012.





An HDB suvey in 2008 showed that a third of households living in one- and two-room flats do not earn any money.
