Key Highlights 2014

Caritas Singapore staged our flagship biennial Social Mission Conference 2014 on 23 August at the Performing Arts Centre of Catholic Junior College with the theme, "I want a Church which is poor and for the poor" drawn from Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium. The conference helped over 700 participants to heighten their awareness of the situation of the poor and also to better understand what Pope Francis meant by this.

The Church has the responsibility to accompany especially the poor and marginalised among us. Our work as Catholic charities calls for a holistic response to the person-in-need. Caritas Singapore developed the concept of "Partnering the Poor" and formulated five "Principles of Service", grounded on Catholic Social Teaching to guide our work as Catholic social mission groups. Our works will uphold the dignity of the person-in-need made in the image of God.

The construction of Agape Village remains on schedule and the four-storey social services hub located at Lorong 8, Toa Payoh will be completed in mid-2015. Agape Village will bring together the resources and services of our 23 social mission groups virtually under "one-roof" to provide an integrated one-stop connection for persons-in-need in the community, regardless of race, religion or nationality and empowering them to tap on their resources and strengths to take responsibility and find a sustainable way to move forward.

Ongoing Core Programmes

Community Strategy

As an umbrella body, Caritas Singapore sets up the Community Strategy Committee to review the community landscape in Singapore and develops strategies to fulfil the Church's social

Formation

Caritas Singapore aims to promote and facilitate a greater understanding of Catholic Social Teaching to Catholics and the wider community in Singapore. We provide formation programmes for our member organisations through various talks and workshops to bring Catholic Social Teaching to their leaders and staff, as well as different groups and communities.

Volunteering

Caritas Singapore continues to promote volunteering and engages potential volunteers to understand their interest areas. We also continue to communicate wth our member organisations to understand their needs for volunteers and build the capacity of their volunteer coordinators.

Charities Week raised more than \$5.5 million and this amount, together with donations received from the Sustained Giving and Many Helping Hands projects, go to support the work of our Catholic social mission groups.

Over \$5.5 million in grants were given out to our member organisations and groups through a rigorous grants process.

Communications

Caritas Singapore developed a communications strategy in 2011 to support our overall organisational objectives and help in the effective engagement of our stakeholders.

Membership and Capacity Building

Caritas Singapore organises regular events and workshops for our 23 member organisations to foster better networking and enable them to work as a community towards providing an integrated and holistic support to help those in need.

Shared Services

Caritas Singapore seeks to synergise resources across our many Catholic social mission groups and enhance service delivery through collaboration. We encourage our member organisations to work together.

Caritas Singapore seeks to raise awareness of issues faced by the poor and marginalised in the community, working at root causes to bring about long term changes. We undertake research and tap on member organisations' analysis and learning to formulate our advocacy work and strategy.
